Plugged In ... 2017 ASAM Cruise



October 2017

Over the 2017 Labor Day weekend, 180 adults from across the North American Division (NAD), and two singles from Australia, sailed from Fort Lauderdale, Fla., to the Bahamas on the Adventist Single Adult Ministries (ASAM) cruise themed "Plugged In."

NAD ASAM directors Pamela and Claudio Consuegra planned the cruise to provide an opportunity for single adults to find spiritual renewal, meet people with whom to develop new relationships and to do activities together, says Pamela.

"Sabbaths can be lonely if you go to church alone, sit in a pew alone, and go home alone for Sabbath dinner," she says. "A sense of loneliness or isolation is one of the top issues for singles in the church," she adds.

<u>Chesapeake Conference Fall</u> <u>Retreat</u> October 13-15, 2017 well-intentioned church members don't know how to reach out to single adults, says Frank Bondurant, a vice president at the Columbia Union and the union's director of ASAM. "Some members think their role is 'match making' when really it would be more helpful just to invite singles over for a meal, or family social activity."

Renee' Mobley, director for Family Ministries for the South Central Conference in the Southern Union, added that non-single members should ask singles what their needs are, then plan activities for and with them.

Malela Rozier, a member of the First church in Dublin, Georgia, attended the cruise in hopes of meeting and mingling with other singles during the worships and other activities. "We have a lot of single people in the church and if we can come together with activities, we can support each other."

In a workshop, Claudio encouraged attendees to get involved in ministry at their local churches. "The cruise is a wonderful thing, but if you depend only on an annual cruise or convention, it isn't enough," he said, and added that there needs to be an ongoing ministry on a regular basis - once a week or month.

During his worship talks, Mike Tucker, speaker/director for Faith for Today Television, encouraged attendees to not wait for the church to create ministries and connections for them. He said singles shouldn't wait to get plugged into the true source of fulfillment - Jesus Christ.

"You make connections by choosing to be of service to others, rather than saying why isn't the church doing this for me?" said Tucker.

Georgia Cumberland Conference Hosts "Letting It Go"

This year Georgia Cumberland Conference initiated our first ever Letting it Go conference, a healing weekend for those experiencing grief and loss, held at Cohutta Springs August 25-27. Speakers David Sedlacek Ph.D, LCSW and his wife Beverly DNP(c) from Andrews University ministered to 97 attendees. In addition to their presentations, the weekend format allowed time for open dialogue, discussion questions, journaling and personal counseling (5 counselors were onsite).

The depth of loss heard in participant stories was overwhelming at times, but in listening to one another, each learned that although we all may be at different stages of the grief process, our stories became a "connecting point." Building friendships with others who had also experienced a significant loss brought a sense of HOPE to everyone.

Here are 2 stories worth sharing:

1. A hospice nurse from the Calhoun community heard about the event and called asking if she could help with the weekend! Jo felt impressed to meet with her and quickly recognized her passion for serving those who are hurting. Jo then invited her to do a presentation on The Importance of Self-Care. What a positive influence she was --- though not [YET] an Adventist!

2. Read this Thank you received (names withheld): "I just want to say thank you so much for hosting the Grief Recovery Weekend. Both ______ and _____ thoroughly enjoyed it and came away refreshed. ______ just called me to thank me for sending her and to say that she was helped tremendously by the main speakers' topics and delivery. She also said that she is finally ready to commit fully to God's calling and join our church through baptism!! I believe the grief she carried from the death of her mother, sister, and a divorce is what was holding her back. PTL, through this weekend, she found God's path beyond these tragedies in her life and can move forward with His plan for her and her family. (No emoji can
